

BOARD MEETING FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH, SELMA APRIL 18, 2021

Present were John Terry, Dave Highbaugh, Kenneshae Murray, Jane Ono, Jordan Williams, Chad Thompson, Jennifer Earle, Kathleen Schales, Alan Langstraat, Vonnie Murray, Teresa Keck.

Meeting began at 11:47 am with lighting of the Christ candle. Chairman John Terry read Matthew 6:33 and the church Mission Statement, then offered opening prayer.

A. Minutes of March 21 meeting corrected by Teresa as follows: last sentence of Pastor's Report should read, "AA asked permission to change their meeting time to 6:30 pm on Fridays." Consent Agenda with corrected minutes approved after motion by Dave, seconded by Alan.

- B. TEAM REPORTS: Spiritual Growth Team organized Easter Service, will meet next Sunday after church.

- 3. Jordan moved to relocate Choir Loft pews to downstairs area. Seconded by Chad and approved by board.
- 4. Staff Evaluations will be done in two parts: (1) self evaluation and (2) face to face evaluation by committee consisting of Leah, John, Jordan and Dave.
- 5. Delegates to Annual Gathering on April 24 on Zoom will be Jennifer and John.
- 6. Education-- Kathleen is willing to lead an Education Team and organize program of Bible Study for all ages, camp, Sunday School and Children's Church. Jennifer will check by-laws concerning Education Team.
- 7. Dave noted that CDC website shows no prohibition on singing through masks. Jennifer and John suggested singing one song during service, possibly printing words on bulletin.
