Repent and Believe

I am writing this on Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. For many this is a day of prayer and fasting. For others it's business as usual. For me, it's a little of both. As I read through the scripture readings for tonight's service, repentance and forgiveness are much on my mind.

Repentance - the activity of reviewing one's actions and feeling contrition or regret for past wrongs, accompanied by commitment to change for the better.

<u>Forgiveness</u> - a conscious, deliberate decision to release feelings of resentment or vengeance toward a person or group who has harmed you, regardless of whether they actually deserve your forgiveness.

There are some spiritual practices designed to help us repent and forgive. One is to write a list of all the people we have harmed so that we may repent and make amends. The other is to write a list of all the people or groups who have harmed us and working toward forgiving them. The name most often left off these lists is our own, and we are often hard put to forgive ourselves.

For example, children often think divorce is their fault and no matter how many times the parents tell them otherwise, they persist in blaming themselves. Abused spouses often blame themselves thinking if they were only better partners their abuser wouldn't "have to" hurt them. If we carry anger or guilt around with us for something that happened a long time ago, we are only hurting ourselves. For these things and others like them we must repent and forgive ourselves. Lent is a good time to examine ourselves to see if there is anything in our hearts that requires repentance or forgiveness. If for some reason we believe that we cannot forgive ourselves, remember that God has already forgiven us, and requires that we forgive others (even ourselves) as many as 77 times if necessary.

Tonight each person attending worship will receive a nail to remind us where this road will lead Jesus, and a purple string to remind us that we are part of a community of faith, walking the road home alongside him. Each face will be marked with ashes in the shape of the cross. Each person will be told, "Repent and believe the Good News," the Good News of God's steadfast love and forgiveness through Jesus Christ. May any darkness on our road home to Jesus this Lenten Season be made light through repentance and forgiveness.






