





Sunday Only?

Now that we are back to in-person worship, I was really looking forward to being able to re-start our Thursday night Worship Replay services. Sadly, some scheduling changes happened and the building isn't available on Thursday evenings, the night that was best for some of our participants. When I mention this and that I am looking for a new night to hold this

service, I hear things like:

"Well, how many people actually attend? Is it worth it to do church for so few people?"

Absolutely. "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." (Matt. 18:20)

"They can go to YouTube and watch our services any time."

True, but they cannot participate the way they can and do at Worship Replay. One person really loved getting to play music in worship. Several prefer the praise music to traditional hymns. Some like the informality (and the shorter service).

Plus, there's that whole "All means ALL" thing to consider. If we **truly** mean that all persons are welcome, then we will find ways to make inperson worship available to all who are able to come to this place. If we truly do want to reach all people, we will offer opportunities other than Sunday for folks to regularly attend worship, meetings, and social events.

Mind you, our live stream services on YouTube are great. They bring our congregation into the homes of people who cannot get to our services on Sunday morning for whatever reason. Some live too far away to drive to Selma - like Nevada and Arkansas. Some are home with young children or elderly parents. Some just aren't ready to be in a large group of people yet. They depend on being able to attend worship with us even when they are not physically present. At least one of our long distance folks has mentioned that they miss the Zoom Coffee Hour we were having on Sundays after worship because it helped them feel connected to the congregation. Offering online worship allows us to **go** far beyond our doors and make disciples of all nations, as Jesus commanded.

But we still need to make room for those who need closer connection and the warmth of community at times other than Sunday. Suggestions and ideas welcome.


